NEW!: As of July 1, 2005, a 12" section of 160psi Siloflex may be used as the handle, instead of the 100psi Siloflex called for in this article, per the Deputy Society Earl Marshal for Combat Archery, THL Eadric Anstapa

Disclaimer #2: This Mace has been designed to be used as a thrown weapon only. It has never been tested or approved by the Society Marshalate as a striking, melee, secondary, or battle weapon. The Throwing Mace is a good weapon for combat archers, or anyone for that matter. It is small and easy to carry in multiples, balances well, throws well, is fun to use, fully gleanable, and hits quite solidly. It began its existence as nothing more than a siege rock on a handle. It is very easy and inexpensive to make.

So let's get started. Put on a good movie or good music and make a cappucino. You will need a worktable or flat surface in which to work.
